AMSTERDAM DNA

WORLD-CITY

World-City focuses on the interaction between Amsterdam and the rest of the world. What was, and is, Amsterdam's position in the world? *World-City* provides answers, but also raises questions. How did Amsterdam and the world see each other, and how do they see each other today? And how do you see them?

FASHION STATEMENTS

Fashion Statements is a stunning visual experience that has more in common with a runway show than a classic exhibition. In it, contemporary designers respond to themes and leading exhibits from the Amsterdam Museum's costume collections. In this exhibition, classics from the collection and contemporary design engage in some interesting and often surprising interaction.

CRIME & PUNISHMENT

Over the years, how has Amsterdam approached the issue of crime and punishment? What used to be a crime and no longer is? For example, adultery was once a criminal offence, but slave trading was considered quite normal until 1814. More minor offences are also featured, such as the 9,000 (!) bikes stolen every year in the streets of Amsterdam. The exhibition takes a journey through crime over the years, also showing how these crimes were punished and prevented.

9 April to 6 September 2020

AMSTERDAM. CITY OF BEER AND BREWERS

The Amsterdam Museum's summer exhibition shows just how much beer and Amsterdam have been inextricably linked over the centuries. The exhibition tells the story of beer from the thirteenth century to the present day. From its modest origins in the Middle Ages, when the city had just a few dozen breweries, through to the global success of beer brands such as Heineken and Amstel.

THE SHORTEST WAY TO THE AMSTERDAM MUSEUM

By coach / car:

Follow the ring road (A10) towards S100, exit to 'Centrum'. Follow the P signs for parking garages in the city centre. The nearest underground car park is 'De Kolk' on the Nieuwezijdse Kolk. You can also use the underground car park at the Town Hall / Music Theatre.

By public transport:

It will take you about 18 minutes to walk from Central Station via the Damrak, the Dam and the Kalverstraat. Or you can take a tram: numbers 2, 11 and 12 (get out at Spui), 4, 14 and 24 (get out at Rokin) or metro number 52 (get out at Rokin).
